- Mt. 3:17** And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I **love**; with him I am well pleased."
- Mt. 5:43-44** "You have heard that it was said, '**Love** your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you: **Love** your enemies and pray for those who persecute you,
- Mt. 5:46** If you **love** those who **love** you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that?
- Mt. 6:5** "And when you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they **love** to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by men. I tell you the truth, they have received their reward in full.
- Mt. 6:24** "No one can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and **love** the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and Money.
- Mt. 10:37** "Anyone who **loves** his father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; anyone who **loves** his son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me;

- Mt. 22:37** Jesus replied: " '**Love** the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.'

- Mt. 23:6-7** they **love** the place of honor at banquets and the most important seats in the synagogues; they **love** to be greeted in the marketplaces and to have men call them 'Rabbi.'
- Mt. 24:12** Because of the increase of wickedness, the **love** of most will grow cold,
- Mk. 1:11** And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I **love**; with you I am well pleased."
- Mk. 9:7** Then a cloud appeared and enveloped them, and a voice came from the cloud: "This is my Son, whom I **love**. Listen to him!"
- Mk. 10:21** Jesus looked at him and **loved** him. "One thing you lack," he said. "Go, sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me."

- Mk. 12:6 “He had one left to send, a son, whom he **loved**. He sent him last of all, saying, ‘They will respect my son.’
- Mk. 12:30-31 **Love** the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.’ The second is this: ‘**Love** your neighbor as yourself.’ There is no commandment greater than these.”
- Mk. 12:33 To **love** him with all your heart, with all your understanding and with all your strength, and to **love** your neighbor as yourself is more important than all burnt offerings and sacrifices.”
- Lk. 3:22 and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: “You are my Son, whom I **love**; with you I am well pleased.”
- Lk. 6:27 “But I tell you who hear me: **Love** your enemies, do good to those who hate you,
- Lk. 6:32 “If you **love** those who **love** you, what credit is that to you? Even ‘sinners’ **love** those who **love** them.
- Lk. 6:35 But **love** your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back. Then your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High, because he is kind to the ungrateful and wicked.
- Lk. 7:5 because he **loves** our nation and has built our synagogue.”
- Lk. 7:42 Neither of them had the money to pay him back, so he canceled the debts of both. Now which of them will **love** him more?”
- Lk. 7:47 Therefore, I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven – for she **loved** much. But he who has been forgiven little **loves** little.”
- Lk. 10:27 He answered: “ ‘**Love** the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind’; and, ‘**Love** your neighbor as yourself.’”
- Lk. 11:42 “Woe to you Pharisees, because you give God a tenth of your mint, rue and all other kinds of garden herbs, but you neglect justice and the **love** of God. You should have practiced the latter without leaving the former undone.
- Lk. 11:43 “Woe to you Pharisees, because you **love** the most important seats in the synagogues and greetings in the marketplaces.
- Lk. 16:13 “No servant can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and **love** the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and Money.”
- Lk. 16:14 The Pharisees, who **loved** money, heard all this and were sneering at Jesus.
- Lk. 20:13 “Then the owner of the vineyard said, ‘What shall I do? I will send my son, whom I **love**; perhaps they will respect him.’
- Lk. 20:46 “Beware of the teachers of the law. They like to walk around in flowing robes and **love** to be greeted in the marketplaces and have the most important seats in the synagogues and the places of honor at banquets.

- Jn. 3:16** “For God so **loved** the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.
- Jn. 3:19** This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but men **loved** darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil.
- Jn. 3:35** The Father **loves** the Son and has placed everything in his hands.
- Jn. 5:20** For the Father **loves** the Son and shows him all he does. Yes, to your amazement he will show him even greater things than these.
- Jn. 5:42** but I know you. I know that you do not have the **love** of God in your hearts.
- Jn. 8:42** Jesus said to them, “If God were your Father, you would **love** me, for I came from God and now am here. I have not come on my own; but he sent me.
- Jn. 10:17** The reason my Father **loves** me is that I lay down my life – only to take it up again.
- Jn. 11:3** So the sisters sent word to Jesus, “Lord, the one you **love** is sick.”
- Jn. 11:5** Jesus **loved** Martha and her sister and Lazarus.
- Jn. 11:36** Then the Jews said, “See how he **loved** him!”
- Jn. 12:25** The man who **loves** his life will lose it, while the man who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life.
- Jn. 12:43** for they **loved** praise from men more than praise from God.
- Jn. 13:1** It was just before the Passover Feast. Jesus knew that the time had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having **loved** his own who were in the world, he now showed them the full extent of his **love**.
- Jn. 13:23** One of them, the disciple whom Jesus **loved**, was reclining next to him.
- Jn. 13:34-35** “A new command I give you: **Love** one another. As I have **loved** you, so you must **love** one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you **love** one another.”
- Jn. 14:15** “If you **love** me, you will obey what I command.
- Jn. 14:21** Whoever has my commands and obeys them, he is the one who **loves** me. He who **loves** me will be **loved** by my Father, and I too will **love** him and show myself to him.”
- Jn. 14:23-24** Jesus replied, “If anyone **loves** me, he will obey my teaching. My Father will **love** him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. He who does not **love** me will not obey my teaching. These words you hear are not my own; they belong to the Father who sent me.
- Jn. 14:28** “You heard me say, ‘I am going away and I am coming back to you.’ If you **loved** me, you would be glad that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I.
- Jn. 14:31** but the world must learn that I **love** the Father and that I do exactly what my Father has commanded me. “Come now; let us leave.

- Jn. 15:9-10** “As the Father has **loved** me, so have I **loved** you. Now remain in my **love**. If you obey my commands, you will remain in my **love**, just as I have obeyed my Father’s commands and remain in his **love**.
- Jn. 15:12-13** My command is this: **Love** each other as I have **loved** you. Greater **love** has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends.
- Jn. 15:17** This is my command: **Love** each other.
- Jn. 15:19** If you belonged to the world, it would **love** you as its own. As it is, you do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world. That is why the world hates you.
- Jn. 16:27** No, the Father himself **loves** you because you have **loved** me and have believed that I came from God.
- Jn. 17:23** I in them and you in me. May they be brought to complete unity to let the world know that you sent me and have **loved** them even as you have **loved** me.
- Jn. 17:24** “Father, I want those you have given me to be with me where I am, and to see my glory, the glory you have given me because you **loved** me before the creation of the world.
- Jn. 17:26** I have made you known to them, and will continue to make you known in order that the **love** you have for me may be in them and that I myself may be in them.”
- Jn. 19:26** When Jesus saw his mother there, and the disciple whom he **loved** standing nearby, he said to his mother, “**Dear woman, here is your son,**”
- Jn. 20:2** So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus **loved**, and said, “They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don’t know where they have put him!”
- Jn. 21:7** Then the disciple whom Jesus **loved** said to Peter, “It is the Lord!” As soon as Simon Peter heard him say, “It is the Lord,” he wrapped his outer garment around him (for he had taken it off) and jumped into the water.
- Jn. 21:15-17** When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, “**Simon son of John, do you truly love me more than these?**”
“Yes, Lord,” he said, “you know that I **love** you.”
Jesus said, “**Feed my lambs.**”
Again Jesus said, “**Simon son of John, do you truly love me?**”
He answered, “Yes, Lord, you know that I **love** you.”
Jesus said, “**Take care of my sheep.**”
The third time he said to him, “**Simon son of John, do you love me?**”
Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, “**Do you love me?**” He said, “Lord, you know all things; you know that I **love** you.”
Jesus said, “**Feed my sheep.**”
- Jn. 21:20** Peter turned and saw that the disciple whom Jesus **loved** was following them. (This was the one who had leaned back against Jesus at the supper and had said, “Lord, who is going to betray you?”)
- Ro. 1:7** To all in Rome who are **loved** by God and called to be saints:
Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

- Ro. 5:5** And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out his **love** into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom he has given us.
- Ro. 5:8** But God demonstrates his own **love** for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.
- Ro. 8:28** And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who **love** him, who have been called according to his purpose.
- Ro. 8:35** Who shall separate us from the **love** of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword?
- Ro. 8:37** No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who **loved** us.
- Ro. 8:39** neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the **love** of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.
- Ro. 9:13** Just as it is written: “Jacob I **loved**, but Esau I hated.”
- Ro. 9:25** As he says in Hosea:
“I will call them ‘my people’ who are not my people;
and I will call her ‘my **loved** one’ who is not my **loved** one,”
- Ro. 11:28** As far as the gospel is concerned, they are enemies on your account; but as far as election is concerned, they are **loved** on account of the patriarchs,
- Ro. 12:9** **Love** must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. Be devoted to one another in brotherly **love**. Honor one another above yourselves.
- Ro. 13:8-10** Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to **love** one another, for he who **loves** his fellowman has fulfilled the law. The commandments, “Do not commit adultery,” “Do not murder,” “Do not steal,” “Do not covet,” and whatever other commandment there may be, are summed up in this one rule: “**Love** your neighbor as yourself.” **Love** does no harm to its neighbor. Therefore **love** is the fulfillment of the law.
- Ro. 14:15** If your brother is distressed because of what you eat, you are no longer acting in **love**. Do not by your eating destroy your brother for whom Christ died.
- Ro. 15:30** I urge you, brothers, by our Lord Jesus Christ and by the **love** of the Spirit, to join me in my struggle by praying to God for me.
- Ro. 16:8** Greet Ampliatus, whom I **love** in the Lord.
- 1Co. 2:9** However, as it is written:
“No eye has seen,
no ear has heard,
no mind has conceived
what God has prepared for those who **love** him” –
- 1Co. 4:17** For this reason I am sending to you Timothy, my son whom I **love**, who is faithful in the Lord. He will remind you of my way of life in Christ Jesus, which agrees with what I teach everywhere in every church.

1Co. 4:21 What do you prefer? Shall I come to you with a whip, or in **love** and with a gentle spirit?

1Co. 8:1 Now about food sacrificed to idols: We know that we all possess knowledge. Knowledge puffs up, but **love** builds up.

1Co. 8:3 But the man who **loves** God is known by God.

1Co. 13:1-3 If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not **love**, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but have not **love**, I am nothing. If I give all I possess to the poor and surrender my body to the flames, but have not **love**, I gain nothing.

1Co. 13:4-8 **Love** is patient, **love** is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. **Love** does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away.

1Co. 13:13 And now these three remain: faith, hope and **love**. But the greatest of these is **love**.

1Co. 14:1 Follow the way of **love** and eagerly desire spiritual gifts, especially the gift of prophecy.

1Co. 16:14 Do everything in **love**.

1Co. 16:22 If anyone does not **love** the Lord – a curse be on him. Come, O Lord!

1Co. 16:24 My **love** to all of you in Christ Jesus. Amen.

2Co. 2:4 For I wrote you out of great distress and anguish of heart and with many tears, not to grieve you but to let you know the depth of my **love** for you.

2Co. 2:8 I urge you, therefore, to reaffirm your **love** for him.

2Co. 5:14 For Christ's **love** compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died.

2Co. 6:6 in purity, understanding, patience and kindness; in the Holy Spirit and in sincere **love**;

2Co. 8:7 But just as you excel in everything – in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in your **love** for us – see that you also excel in this grace of giving.

2Co. 8:8 I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your **love** by comparing it with the earnestness of others.

2Co. 8:24 Therefore show these men the proof of your **love** and the reason for our pride in you, so that the churches can see it.

2Co. 9:7 Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God **loves** a cheerful giver.

2Co. 11:11 Why? Because I do not **love** you? God knows I do!

2Co. 12:15 So I will very gladly spend for you everything I have and expend myself as well. If I **love** you more, will you **love** me less?

2Co. 13:11 Finally, brothers, good-bye. Aim for perfection, listen to my appeal, be of one mind, live in peace. And the God of **love** and peace will be with you.

2Co. 13:14 May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the **love** of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

Gal. 2:20 I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who **loved** me and gave himself for me.

Gal. 5:6 For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision has any value. The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through **love**.

Gal. 5:13-14 You, my brothers, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature; rather, serve one another in **love**. The entire law is summed up in a single command: "**Love** your neighbor as yourself."

Gal. 5:22-23 But the fruit of the Spirit is **love**, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.

Eph. 1:4 For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In **love**

Eph. 1:6 to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he **loves**.

Eph. 1:15 For this reason, ever since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your **love** for all the saints,

Eph. 2:4 But because of his great **love** for us, God, who is rich in mercy,

Eph. 3:17-19 so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in **love**, may have power, together with all the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the **love** of Christ, and to know this **love** that surpasses knowledge – that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.

Eph. 4:2 Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in **love**.

Eph. 4:15-16 Instead, speaking the truth in **love**, we will in all things grow up into him who is the Head, that is, Christ. From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in **love**, as each part does its work.

Eph. 5:1-2 Be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly **loved** children and live a life of **love**, just as Christ **loved** us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

Eph. 5:25 Husbands, **love** your wives, just as Christ **loved** the church and gave himself up for her

Eph. 5:28 In this same way, husbands ought to **love** their wives as their own bodies. He who **loves** his wife **loves** himself.

Eph. 5:33 However, each one of you also must **love** his wife as he **loves** himself, and the wife must respect her husband.

Eph. 6:23-24 Peace to the brothers, and **love** with faith from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Grace to all who **love** our Lord Jesus Christ with an undying **love**.

Pp. 1:9 And this is my prayer: that your **love** may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight,

Pp. 1:16 The latter do so in **love**, knowing that I am put here for the defense of the gospel.

Pp. 2:1-2 If you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his **love**, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same **love**, being one in spirit and purpose.

Pp. 4:1 Therefore, my brothers, you whom I **love** and long for, my joy and crown, that is how you should stand firm in the Lord, dear friends!

Col. 1:4-5 because we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the **love** you have for all the saints – the faith and **love** that spring from the hope that is stored up for you in heaven and that you have already heard about in the word of truth, the gospel

Col. 1:8 and who also told us of your **love** in the Spirit.

Col. 1:13 For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he **loves**,

Col. 2:2 My purpose is that they may be encouraged in heart and united in **love**, so that they may have the full riches of complete understanding, in order that they may know the mystery of God, namely, Christ,

Col. 3:12 Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly **loved**, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.

Col. 3:14 And over all these virtues put on **love**, which binds them all together in perfect unity.

Col. 3:19 Husbands, **love** your wives and do not be harsh with them.

1Th. 1:3 We continually remember before our God and Father your work produced by faith, your labor prompted by **love**, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

1Th. 1:4 For we know, brothers **loved** by God, that he has chosen you,

1Th. 2:8 We **loved** you so much that we were delighted to share with you not only the gospel of God but our lives as well, because you had become so dear to us.

1Th. 3:6 But Timothy has just now come to us from you and has brought good news about your faith and **love**. He has told us that you always have pleasant memories of us and that you long to see us, just as we also long to see you.

1Th. 3:12 May the Lord make your **love** increase and overflow for each other and for everyone else, just as ours does for you.

1Th. 4:9-10 Now about brotherly **love** we do not need to write to you, for you yourselves have been taught by God to **love** each other. And in fact, you do **love** all the brothers throughout Macedonia. Yet we urge you, brothers, to do so more and more.

1Th. 5:8 But since we belong to the day, let us be self-controlled, putting on faith and **love** as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet.

1Th. 5:13 Hold them in the highest regard in **love** because of their work. Live in peace with each other.

2Th. 1:3 We ought always to thank God for you, brothers, and rightly so, because your faith is growing more and more, and the **love** every one of you has for each other is increasing.

2Th. 2:10 and in every sort of evil that deceives those who are perishing. They perish because they refused to **love** the truth and so be saved.

2Th. 2:13 But we ought always to thank God for you, brothers **loved** by the Lord, because from the beginning God chose you to be saved through the sanctifying work of the Spirit and through belief in the truth.

2Th. 2:16 May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who **loved** us and by his grace gave us eternal encouragement and good hope,

2Th. 3:5 May the Lord direct your hearts into God's **love** and Christ's perseverance.

1Tim. 1:5 The goal of this command is **love**, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.

1Tim. 1:14 The grace of our Lord was poured out on me abundantly, along with the faith and **love** that are in Christ Jesus.

1Tim. 2:15 But women will be saved through childbearing – if they continue in faith, **love** and holiness with propriety.

1Tim. 3:3 not given to drunkenness, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a **lover** of money.

1Tim. 4:12 Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in life, in **love**, in faith and in purity.

1Tim. 6:10 For the **love** of money is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs.

1Tim. 6:11 But you, man of God, flee from all this, and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, **love**, endurance and gentleness.

2Tim. 1:7 For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of **love** and of self-discipline.

2Tim. 1:13 What you heard from me, keep as the pattern of sound teaching, with faith and **love** in Christ Jesus.

- 2Tim. 2:22** Flee the evil desires of youth, and pursue righteousness, faith, **love** and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart.
- 2Tim. 3:2-4** People will be **lovers** of themselves, **lovers** of money, boastful, proud, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, without **love**, unforgiving, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not **lovers** of the good, treacherous, rash, conceited, **lovers** of pleasure rather than **lovers** of God –
- 2Tim. 3:10** You, however, know all about my teaching, my way of life, my purpose, faith, patience, **love**, endurance,
- 2Tim. 4:10** for Demas, because he **loved** this world, has deserted me and has gone to Thessalonica. Crescens has gone to Galatia, and Titus to Dalmatia.
- Tit. 1:8** Rather he must be hospitable, one who **loves** what is good, who is self-controlled, upright, holy and disciplined.
- Tit. 2:2** Teach the older men to be temperate, worthy of respect, self-controlled, and sound in faith, in **love** and in endurance.
- Tit. 2:4** Then they can train the younger women to **love** their husbands and children,
- Tit. 3:4** But when the kindness and **love** of God our Savior appeared,
- Tit. 3:15** Everyone with me sends you greetings. Greet those who **love** us in the faith. Grace be with you all.
- Pm. 5** because I hear about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your **love** for all the saints.
- Pm. 7** Your **love** has given me great joy and encouragement, because you, brother, have refreshed the hearts of the saints.
- Pm. 9** yet I appeal to you on the basis of **love**. I then, as Paul – an old man and now also a prisoner of Christ Jesus –
- Heb. 1:9** You have **loved** righteousness and hated wickedness; therefore God, your God, has set you above your companions by anointing you with the oil of joy.”
- Heb. 6:10** God is not unjust; he will not forget your work and the **love** you have shown him as you have helped his people and continue to help them.
- Heb. 10:24** And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward **love** and good deeds.
- Heb. 12:6** because the Lord disciplines those he **loves**, and he punishes everyone he accepts as a son.”
- Heb. 13:1** Keep on **loving** each other as brothers.

- Heb. 13:5** Keep your lives free from the **love** of money and be content with what you have, because God has said,
“Never will I leave you;
never will I forsake you.”
- Jas. 1:12** Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial, because when he has stood the test, he will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who **love** him.
- Jas. 2:5** Listen, my dear brothers: Has not God chosen those who are poor in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith and to inherit the kingdom he promised those who **love** him?
- Jas. 2:8** If you really keep the royal law found in Scripture, “**Love** your neighbor as yourself,” you are doing right.
- 1Pt. 1:8** Though you have not seen him, you **love** him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy,
- 1Pt. 1:22** Now that you have purified yourselves by obeying the truth so that you have sincere **love** for your brothers, **love** one another deeply, from the heart.
- 1Pt. 2:17** Show proper respect to everyone: **Love** the brotherhood of believers, fear God, honor the king.
- 1Pt. 3:8** Finally, all of you, live in harmony with one another; be sympathetic, **love** as brothers, be compassionate and humble.
- 1Pt. 3:10** For, “Whoever would **love** life and see good days must keep his tongue from evil and his lips from deceitful speech.
- 1Pt. 4:8** Above all, **love** each other deeply, because **love** covers over a multitude of sins.
- 1Pt. 5:14** Greet one another with a kiss of **love**.
Peace to all of you who are in Christ.
- 2Pt. 1:7** and to godliness, brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness, **love**.
- 2Pt. 1:17** For he received honor and glory from God the Father when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, saying, “This is my Son, whom I **love**; with him I am well pleased.”
- 2Pt. 2:15** They have left the straight way and wandered off to follow the way of Balaam son of Beor, who **loved** the wages of wickedness.
- 1Jn. 2:5** But if anyone obeys his word, God’s **love** is truly made complete in him. This is how we know we are in him:
- 1Jn. 2:10** Whoever **loves** his brother lives in the light, and there is nothing in him to make him stumble.
- 1Jn. 2:15** Do not **love** the world or anything in the world. If anyone **loves** the world, the **love** of the Father is not in him.

1Jn. 3:1 How great is the **love** the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him.

1Jn. 3:10 This is how we know who the children of God are and who the children of the devil are: Anyone who does not do what is right is not a child of God; nor is anyone who does not **love** his brother.

1Jn. 3:11 This is the message you heard from the beginning: We should **love** one another.

1Jn. 3:14 We know that we have passed from death to life, because we **love** our brothers. Anyone who does not **love** remains in death.

1Jn. 3:16-18 This is how we know what **love** is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers. If anyone has material possessions and sees his brother in need but has no pity on him, how can the **love** of God be in him? Dear children, let us not **love** with words or tongue but with actions and in truth.

1Jn. 3:23 And this is his command: to believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and to **love** one another as he commanded us.

1Jn. 4:7-12 Dear friends, let us **love** one another, for **love** comes from God. Everyone who **loves** has been born of God and knows God. Whoever does not **love** does not know God, because God is **love**. This is how God showed his **love** among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is **love**: not that we **loved** God, but that he **loved** us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since God so **loved** us, we also ought to **love** one another. No one has ever seen God; but if we **love** one another, God lives in us and his **love** is made complete in us.

1Jn. 4:16-18 And so we know and rely on the **love** God has for us.

God is **love**. Whoever lives in **love** lives in God, and God in him. In this way, **love** is made complete among us so that we will have confidence on the day of judgment, because in this world we are like him. There is no fear in **love**. But perfect **love** drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in **love**.

1Jn. 4:19-21 We **love** because he first **loved** us. If anyone says, "I **love** God," yet hates his brother, he is a liar. For anyone who does not **love** his brother, whom he has seen, cannot **love** God, whom he has not seen. And he has given us this command: Whoever **loves** God must also **love** his brother.

1Jn. 5:1 Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is born of God, and everyone who **loves** the father **loves** his child as well.

1Jn. 5:2-3 This is how we know that we **love** the children of God: by **loving** God and carrying out his commands. This is **love** for God: to obey his commands. And his commands are not burdensome,

2Jn. 1 The elder,
To the chosen lady and her children, whom I **love** in the truth – and not I only, but also all who know the truth –

2Jn. 3 Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and from Jesus Christ, the Father's Son, will be with us in truth and **love**.

- 2Jn. 5-6** And now, dear lady, I am not writing you a new command but one we have had from the beginning. I ask that we **love** one another. And this is **love**: that we walk in obedience to his commands. As you have heard from the beginning, his command is that you walk in **love**.
- 3Jn. 1** The elder,
To my dear friend Gaius, whom I **love** in the truth.
- 3Jn. 6** They have told the church about your **love**. You will do well to send them on their way in a manner worthy of God.
- 3Jn. 9** I wrote to the church, but Diotrephes, who **loves** to be first, will have nothing to do with us.
- Jde. 1** Jude, a servant of Jesus Christ and a brother of James,
To those who have been called, who are **loved** by God the Father and kept by Jesus Christ:
- Jde. 2** Mercy, peace and **love** be yours in abundance.
- Jde. 12** These men are blemishes at your **love** feasts, eating with you without the slightest qualm – shepherds who feed only themselves. They are clouds without rain, blown along by the wind; autumn trees, without fruit and uprooted – twice dead.
- Jude 21** Keep yourselves in God's **love** as you wait for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to bring you to eternal life.
- Rev. 1:5** and from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth.
To him who **loves** us and has freed us from our sins by his blood,
- Rev. 2:4** Yet I hold this against you: You have forsaken your first **love**.
- Rev. 2:19** I know your deeds, your **love** and faith, your service and perseverance, and that you are now doing more than you did at first.
- Rev. 3:9** I will make those who are of the synagogue of Satan, who claim to be Jews though they are not, but are liars – I will make them come and fall down at your feet and acknowledge that I have **loved** you.
- Rev. 3:19** Those whom I **love** I rebuke and discipline. So be earnest, and repent.
- Rev. 12:11** They overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony; they did not **love** their lives so much as to shrink from death.
- Rev. 20:9** They marched across the breadth of the earth and surrounded the camp of God's people, the city he **loves**. But fire came down from heaven and devoured them.
- Rev. 22:15** Outside are the dogs, those who practice magic arts, the sexually immoral, the murderers, the idolaters and everyone who **loves** and practices falsehood.
