Ex. 10:3 So Moses and Aaron went to Pharaoh and said to him, “This is what the LORD, the God of the Hebrews, says: ‘How long will you refuse to **humble** yourself before me? Let my people go, so that they may worship me.

Lev. 26:41 which made me hostile toward them so that I sent them into the land of their enemies – then when their uncircumcised hearts are **humbled** and they pay for their sin,

Num. 12:3 (Now Moses was a very **humble** man, more **humble** than anyone else on the face of the earth.)

Dt. 8:2-3 Remember how the LORD your God led you all the way in the desert these forty years, to **humble** you and to test you in order to know what was in your heart, whether or not you would keep his commands. He **humbled** you, causing you to hunger and then feeding you with manna, which neither you nor your fathers had known, to teach you that man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD.

Dt. 8:16 He gave you manna to eat in the desert, something your fathers had never known, to **humble** and to test you so that in the end it might go well with you.

1Sa. 2:7 The LORD sends poverty and wealth;
he **humbles** and he exalts.

2Sa. 22:28 You save the **humble**,
but your eyes are on the haughty to bring them low.

1Ki. 11:39 I will **humble** David’s descendants because of this, but not forever.”

1Ki. 21:29 “Have you noticed how Ahab has **humbled** himself before me? Because he has **humbled** himself, I will not bring this disaster in his day, but I will bring it on his house in the days of his son.”

2Ki. 22:19 Because your heart was responsive and you **humbled** yourself before the LORD when you heard what I have spoken against this place and its people, that they would become accursed and laid waste, and because you tore your robes and wept in my presence, I have heard you, declares the LORD.

2Chr. 7:14 if my people, who are called by my name, will **humble** themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land.

2Chr. 12:6-7 The leaders of Israel and the king **humbled** themselves and said, “The LORD is just.”

When the LORD saw that they **humbled** themselves, this word of the LORD came to Shemaiah: “Since they have **humbled** themselves, I will not destroy them but will soon give them deliverance. My wrath will not be poured out on Jerusalem through Shishak.

2Chr. 12:12 Because Rehoboam **humbled** himself, the LORD's anger turned from him, and he was not totally destroyed. Indeed, there was some good in Judah.

2Chr. 28:19 The LORD had **humbled** Judah because of Ahaz king of Israel, for he had promoted wickedness in Judah and had been most unfaithful to the LORD.

2Chr. 30:11 Nevertheless, some men of Asher, Manasseh and Zebulun **humbled** themselves and went to Jerusalem.

2Chr. 33:12 In his distress he sought the favor of the LORD his God and **humbled** himself greatly before the God of his fathers.

2Chr. 33:19 His prayer and how God was moved by his entreaty, as well as all his sins and unfaithfulness, and the sites where he built high places and set up Asherah poles and idols before he **humbled** himself – all are written in the records of the seers.

2Chr. 33:23 But unlike his father Manasseh, he did not **humble** himself before the LORD; Amon increased his guilt.

2Chr. 34:27 Because your heart was responsive and you **humbled** yourself before God when you heard what he spoke against this place and its people, and because you **humbled** yourself before me and tore your robes and wept in my presence, I have heard you, declares the LORD.

2Chr. 36:12 He did evil in the eyes of the LORD his God and did not **humble** himself before Jeremiah the prophet, who spoke the word of the LORD.

Ezr. 8:21 There, by the Ahava Canal, I proclaimed a fast, so that we might **humble** ourselves before our God and ask him for a safe journey for us and our children, with all our possessions.

Job 8:7 Your beginnings will seem **humble**,
so prosperous will your future be.

Job 40:12 look at every proud man and **humble** him,
crush the wicked where they stand.

Ps. 18:27 You save the **humble**
but bring low those whose eyes are haughty.

Ps. 25:9 He guides the **humble** in what is right
and teaches them his way.

Ps. 35:13 Yet when they were ill, I put on sackcloth
and **humbled** myself with fasting.
When my prayers returned to me unanswered,

Ps. 44:9 But now you have rejected and **humbled** us;
you no longer go out with our armies.

- Ps. 45:4** In your majesty ride forth victoriously
in behalf of truth, **humility** and righteousness;
let your right hand display awesome deeds.
- Ps. 68:30** Rebuke the beast among the reeds,
the herd of bulls among the calves of the nations.
Humbled, may it bring bars of silver.
Scatter the nations who delight in war.
- Ps. 107:39** Then their numbers decreased, and they were **humbled**
by oppression, calamity and sorrow;
- Ps. 147:6** The LORD sustains the **humble**
but casts the wicked to the ground.
- Ps. 149:4** For the LORD takes delight in his people;
he crowns the **humble** with salvation.
- Pr. 3:34** He mocks proud mockers
but gives grace to the **humble**.
- Pr. 6:3** then do this, my son, to free yourself,
since you have fallen into your neighbor's hands:
Go and **humble** yourself;
press your plea with your neighbor!
- Pr. 11:2** When pride comes, then comes disgrace,
but with **humility** comes wisdom.
- Pr. 15:33** The fear of the LORD teaches a man wisdom,
and **humility** comes before honor.
- Pr. 18:12** Before his downfall a man's heart is proud,
but **humility** comes before honor.
- Pr. 22:4** **Humility** and the fear of the LORD
bring wealth and honor and life.
- Is. 2:9** So man will be brought low
and mankind **humbled** –
do not forgive them.
- Is. 2:11** The eyes of the arrogant man will be **humbled**
and the pride of men brought low;
the LORD alone will be exalted in that day.
- Is. 2:12** The LORD Almighty has a day in store
for all the proud and lofty,
for all that is exalted
(and they will be **humbled**),

- Is. 2:17** The arrogance of man will be brought low
and the pride of men **humbled**;
the LORD alone will be exalted in that day,
- Is. 5:15** So man will be brought low
and mankind **humbled**,
the eyes of the arrogant **humbled**.
- Is. 9:1** Nevertheless, there will be no more gloom for those who were in distress. In
the past he **humbled** the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in the future
he will honor Galilee of the Gentiles, by the way of the sea, along the Jordan –
- Is. 13:11** I will punish the world for its evil,
the wicked for their sins.
I will put an end to the arrogance of the haughty
and will **humble** the pride of the ruthless.
- Is. 23:9** The LORD Almighty planned it,
to bring low the pride of all glory
and to **humble** all who are renowned on the earth.
- Is. 26:5** He **humbles** those who dwell on high,
he lays the lofty city low;
he levels it to the ground
and casts it down to the dust.
- Is. 29:19** Once more the **humble** will rejoice in the LORD;
the needy will rejoice in the Holy One of Israel.
- Is. 58:3** ‘Why have we fasted,’ they say,
‘and you have not seen it?’
Why have we **humbled** ourselves,
and you have not noticed?’
“Yet on the day of your fasting, you do as you please
and exploit all your workers.
- Is. 58:5** Is this the kind of fast I have chosen,
only a day for a man to **humble** himself?
Is it only for bowing one’s head like a reed
and for lying on sackcloth and ashes?
Is that what you call a fast,
a day acceptable to the LORD?
- Is. 66:2** Has not my hand made all these things,
and so they came into being?” declares the LORD.
“This is the one I esteem:
he who is **humble** and contrite in spirit,
and trembles at my word.
- Jer. 44:10** To this day they have not **humbled** themselves or shown reverence, nor
have they followed my law and the decrees I set before you and your fathers.

- Dan. 4:37** Now I, Nebuchadnezzar, praise and exalt and glorify the King of heaven, because everything he does is right and all his ways are just. And those who walk in pride he is able to **humble**.
- Dan. 5:19** Because of the high position he gave him, all the peoples and nations and men of every language dreaded and feared him. Those the king wanted to put to death, he put to death; those he wanted to spare, he spared; those he wanted to promote, he promoted; and those he wanted to **humble**, he **humbled**.
- Dan. 5:22** "But you his son, O Belshazzar, have not **humbled** yourself, though you knew all this.
- Dan. 10:12** Then he continued, "Do not be afraid, Daniel. Since the first day that you set your mind to gain understanding and to **humble** yourself before your God, your words were heard, and I have come in response to them.
- Zph. 2:3** Seek the LORD, all you **humble** of the land,
you who do what he commands.
Seek righteousness, seek **humility**;
perhaps you will be sheltered
on the day of the LORD's anger.
- Zph. 3:12** But I will leave within you
the meek and **humble**,
who trust in the name of the LORD.
- Mt. 11:29** Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and **humble** in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.
- Mt. 18:4** Therefore, whoever **humbles** himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.
- Mt. 23:12** For whoever exalts himself will be **humbled**, and whoever **humbles** himself will be exalted.
- Lk. 1:48** for he has been mindful
of the **humble** state of his servant.
From now on all generations will call me blessed,
- Lk. 1:52** He has brought down rulers from their thrones
but has lifted up the **humble**.
- Lk. 14:11** For everyone who exalts himself will be **humbled**, and he who **humbles** himself will be exalted."
- Lk. 18:14** "I tell you that this man, rather than the other, went home justified before God. For everyone who exalts himself will be **humbled**, and he who **humbles** himself will be exalted."
- Ac. 20:19** I served the Lord with great **humility** and with tears, although I was severely tested by the plots of the Jews.

2Co. 12:21 I am afraid that when I come again my God will **humble** me before you, and I will be grieved over many who have sinned earlier and have not repented of the impurity, sexual sin and debauchery in which they have indulged.

Eph. 4:2 Be completely **humble** and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love.

Pp. 2:3 Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in **humility** consider others better than yourselves.

Pp. 2:8 And being found in appearance as a man,
he **humbled** himself
and became obedient to death –
even death on a cross!

Col. 2:18 Do not let anyone who delights in false **humility** and the worship of angels disqualify you for the prize. Such a person goes into great detail about what he has seen, and his unspiritual mind puffs him up with idle notions.

Col. 2:23 Such regulations indeed have an appearance of wisdom, with their self-imposed worship, their false **humility** and their harsh treatment of the body, but they lack any value in restraining sensual indulgence.

Col. 3:12 Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, **humility**, gentleness and patience.

Tit. 3:2 to slander no one, to be peaceable and considerate, and to show true **humility** toward all men.

Jas. 1:9 The brother in **humble** circumstances ought to take pride in his high position.

Jas. 3:13 Who is wise and understanding among you? Let him show it by his good life, by deeds done in the **humility** that comes from wisdom.

Jas. 4:6 But he gives us more grace. That is why Scripture says: "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the **humble**."

Jas. 4:10 **Humble** yourselves before the Lord, and he will lift you up.

1Pt. 3:8 Finally, all of you, live in harmony with one another; be sympathetic, love as brothers, be compassionate and **humble**.

1Pt. 5:5-6 Young men, in the same way be submissive to those who are older. All of you, clothe yourselves with **humility** toward one another, because, "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the **humble**." **Humble** yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time.
