

## pride / proud / proudly (116)

- Lev. 26:19** I will break down your stubborn **pride** and make the sky above you like iron and the ground beneath you like bronze.
- Dt. 8:14** then your heart will become **proud** and you will forget the LORD your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery.
- 1Sam. 2:3** “Do not keep talking so **proudly**  
or let your mouth speak such arrogance,  
for the LORD is a God who knows,  
and by him deeds are weighed.
- 2Ki. 19:22** Who is it you have insulted and blasphemed?  
Against whom have you raised your voice  
and lifted your eyes in **pride**?  
Against the Holy One of Israel!
- 2Chr. 25:19** You say to yourself that you have defeated Edom, and now you are arrogant and **proud**. But stay at home! Why ask for trouble and cause your own downfall and that of Judah also?”
- 2Chr. 26:16** But after Uzziah became powerful, his **pride** led to his downfall. He was unfaithful to the LORD his God, and entered the temple of the LORD to burn incense on the altar of incense.
- 2Chr. 32:25-26** But Hezekiah’s heart was **proud** and he did not respond to the kindness shown him; therefore the LORD’s wrath was on him and on Judah and Jerusalem. Then Hezekiah repented of the **pride** of his heart, as did the people of Jerusalem; therefore the LORD’s wrath did not come upon them during the days of Hezekiah.
- Job 20:6** Though his **pride** reaches to the heavens  
and his head touches the clouds,
- Job 28:8** **Proud** beasts do not set foot on it,  
and no lion prowls there.
- Job 33:17** to turn man from wrongdoing  
and keep him from **pride**,
- Job 38:11** when I said, ‘This far you may come and no farther;  
here is where your **proud** waves halt’?
- Job 39:20** Do you make him leap like a locust,  
striking terror with his **proud** snorting?
- Job 40:11-12** Unleash the fury of your wrath,  
look at every **proud** man and bring him low,  
look at every **proud** man and humble him,  
crush the wicked where they stand.

- Job 41:34** He looks down on all that are haughty;  
he is king over all that are **proud**.”
- Ps. 10:4** In his **pride** the wicked does not seek him;  
in all his thoughts there is no room for God.
- Ps. 31:18** Let their lying lips be silenced,  
for with **pride** and contempt  
they speak arrogantly against the righteous.
- Ps. 31:23** Love the LORD, all his saints!  
The LORD preserves the faithful,  
but the **proud** he pays back in full.
- Ps. 36:11** May the foot of the **proud** not come against me,  
nor the hand of the wicked drive me away.
- Ps. 40:4** Blessed is the man  
who makes the LORD his trust,  
who does not look to the **proud**,  
to those who turn aside to false gods.
- Ps. 47:4** He chose our inheritance for us,  
the **pride** of Jacob, whom he loved. *Selah*
- Ps. 56:2** My slanderers pursue me all day long;  
many are attacking me in their **pride**.
- Ps. 59:12** For the sins of their mouths,  
for the words of their lips,  
let them be caught in their **pride**.  
For the curses and lies they utter,
- Ps. 62:10** Do not trust in extortion  
or take **pride** in stolen goods;  
though your riches increase,  
do not set your heart on them.
- Ps. 73:6** Therefore **pride** is their necklace;  
they clothe themselves with violence.
- Ps. 94:2** Rise up, O Judge of the earth;  
pay back to the **proud** what they deserve.
- Ps. 101:5** Whoever slanders his neighbor in secret,  
him will I put to silence;  
whoever has haughty eyes and a **proud** heart,  
him will I not endure.
- Ps. 123:4** We have endured much ridicule from the **proud**,  
much contempt from the arrogant.

- Ps. 131:1** My heart is not **proud**, O LORD,  
my eyes are not haughty;  
I do not concern myself with great matters  
or things too wonderful for me.
- Ps. 138:6** Though the LORD is on high, he looks upon the lowly,  
but the **proud** he knows from afar.
- Ps. 140:5** **Proud** men have hidden a snare for me;  
they have spread out the cords of their net  
and have set traps for me along my path. *Selah*
- Ps. 140:8** do not grant the wicked their desires, O LORD;  
do not let their plans succeed,  
or they will become **proud**. *Selah*
- Pr. 3:34** He mocks **proud** mockers  
but gives grace to the humble.
- Pr. 8:13** To fear the LORD is to hate evil;  
I hate **pride** and arrogance,  
evil behavior and perverse speech.
- Pr. 11:2** When **pride** comes, then comes disgrace,  
but with humility comes wisdom.
- Pr. 13:10** **Pride** only breeds quarrels,  
but wisdom is found in those who take advice.
- Pr. 15:25** The LORD tears down the **proud** man's house  
but he keeps the widow's boundaries intact.
- Pr. 16:5** The LORD detests all the **proud** of heart.  
Be sure of this: They will not go unpunished.
- Pr. 16:18** **Pride** goes before destruction,  
a haughty spirit before a fall.
- Pr. 16:19** Better to be lowly in spirit and among the oppressed  
than to share plunder with the **proud**.
- Pr. 17:6** Children's children are a crown to the aged,  
and parents are the **pride** of their children.
- Pr. 18:12** Before his downfall a man's heart is **proud**,  
but humility comes before honor.
- Pr. 21:4** Haughty eyes and a **proud** heart,  
the lamp of the wicked, are sin!
- Pr. 21:24** The **proud** and arrogant man – "Mocker" is his name;  
he behaves with overweening **pride**.

- Pr. 29:23** A man's **pride** brings him low,  
but a man of lowly spirit gains honor.
- Ecc. 7:8** The end of a matter is better than its beginning,  
and patience is better than **pride**.
- Is. 2:11** The eyes of the arrogant man will be humbled  
and the **pride** of men brought low;  
the LORD alone will be exalted in that day.
- Is. 2:12** The LORD Almighty has a day in store  
for all the **proud** and lofty,  
for all that is exalted  
(and they will be humbled),
- Is. 2:17** The arrogance of man will be brought low  
and the **pride** of men humbled;  
the LORD alone will be exalted in that day,
- Is. 4:2** In that day the Branch of the LORD will be beautiful and glorious, and the fruit  
of the land will be the **pride** and glory of the survivors in Israel.
- Is. 9:9** All the people will know it –  
Ephraim and the inhabitants of Samaria –  
who say with **pride**  
and arrogance of heart,
- Is. 10:12** When the Lord has finished all his work against Mount Zion and Jerusalem,  
he will say, "I will punish the king of Assyria for the willful **pride** of his heart and the  
haughty look in his eyes.
- Is. 13:11** I will punish the world for its evil,  
the wicked for their sins.  
I will put an end to the arrogance of the haughty  
and will humble the **pride** of the ruthless.
- Is. 13:19** Babylon, the jewel of kingdoms,  
the glory of the Babylonians' **pride**,  
will be overthrown by God  
like Sodom and Gomorrah.
- Is. 16:6** We have heard of Moab's **pride** –  
her overweening **pride** and conceit,  
her **pride** and her insolence –  
but her boasts are empty.
- Is. 23:9** The LORD Almighty planned it,  
to bring low the **pride** of all glory  
and to humble all who are renowned on the earth.

- Is. 25:11** They will spread out their hands in it,  
as a swimmer spreads out his hands to swim.  
God will bring down their **pride**  
despite the cleverness of their hands.
- Is. 28:1** Woe to that wreath, the **pride** of Ephraim's drunkards,  
to the fading flower, his glorious beauty,  
set on the head of a fertile valley –  
to that city, the **pride** of those laid low by wine!
- Is. 28:3** That wreath, the **pride** of Ephraim's drunkards,  
will be trampled underfoot.
- Is. 37:23** Who is it you have insulted and blasphemed?  
Against whom have you raised your voice  
and lifted your eyes in **pride**?  
Against the Holy One of Israel!
- Is. 43:14** This is what the LORD says –  
your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel:  
“For your sake I will send to Babylon  
and bring down as fugitives all the Babylonians,  
in the ships in which they took **pride**.”
- Is. 60:15** “Although you have been forsaken and hated,  
with no one traveling through,  
I will make you the everlasting **pride**  
and the joy of all generations.
- Jer. 13:9** “This is what the LORD says: ‘In the same way I will ruin the **pride** of Judah  
and the great **pride** of Jerusalem.
- Jer. 13:17** But if you do not listen,  
I will weep in secret  
because of your **pride**;  
my eyes will weep bitterly,  
overflowing with tears,  
because the LORD's flock will be taken captive.
- Jer. 48:29** “We have heard of Moab's **pride** –  
her overweening **pride** and conceit,  
her **pride** and arrogance  
and the haughtiness of her heart.
- Jer. 49:16** The terror you inspire  
and the **pride** of your heart have deceived you,  
you who live in the clefts of the rocks,  
who occupy the heights of the hill.  
Though you build your nest as high as the eagle's,  
from there I will bring you down,” declares the LORD.

- Ez. 7:20** They were **proud** of their beautiful jewelry and used it to make their detestable idols and vile images. Therefore I will turn these into an unclean thing for them.
- Ez. 7:24** I will bring the most wicked of the nations to take possession of their houses; I will put an end to the **pride** of the mighty, and their sanctuaries will be desecrated.
- Ez. 16:56** You would not even mention your sister Sodom in the day of your **pride**,
- Ez. 24:21** Say to the house of Israel, ‘This is what the Sovereign LORD says: I am about to desecrate my sanctuary – the stronghold in which you take **pride**, the delight of your eyes, the object of your affection. The sons and daughters you left behind will fall by the sword.
- Ez. 28:2** “Son of man, say to the ruler of Tyre, ‘This is what the Sovereign LORD says:  
“ ‘In the **pride** of your heart  
you say, “I am a god;  
I sit on the throne of a god  
in the heart of the seas.”  
But you are a man and not a god,  
though you think you are as wise as a god.
- Ez. 28:5** By your great skill in trading  
you have increased your wealth,  
and because of your wealth  
your heart has grown **proud**.
- Ez. 28:17** Your heart became **proud**  
on account of your beauty,  
and you corrupted your wisdom  
because of your splendor.  
So I threw you to the earth;  
I made a spectacle of you before kings.
- Ez. 30:6** “ ‘This is what the LORD says:  
“ ‘The allies of Egypt will fall  
and her **proud** strength will fail.  
From Migdol to Aswan  
they will fall by the sword within her, declares the Sovereign LORD.
- Ez. 30:18** Dark will be the day at Tahpanhes  
when I break the yoke of Egypt;  
there her **proud** strength will come to an end.  
She will be covered with clouds,  
and her villages will go into captivity.
- Ez. 31:10** “ ‘Therefore this is what the Sovereign LORD says: Because it towered on high, lifting its top above the thick foliage, and because it was **proud** of its height,

- Ez. 31:14** Therefore no other trees by the waters are ever to tower **proudly** on high, lifting their tops above the thick foliage. No other trees so well-watered are ever to reach such a height; they are all destined for death, for the earth below, among mortal men, with those who go down to the pit.
- Ez. 32:12** I will cause your hordes to fall  
by the swords of mighty men –  
the most ruthless of all nations.  
They will shatter the **pride** of Egypt,  
and all her hordes will be overthrown.
- Ez. 33:28** I will make the land a desolate waste, and her **proud** strength will come to an end, and the mountains of Israel will become desolate so that no one will cross them.
- Dan. 4:37** Now I, Nebuchadnezzar, praise and exalt and glorify the King of heaven, because everything he does is right and all his ways are just. And those who walk in **pride** he is able to humble.
- Dan. 5:20** But when his heart became arrogant and hardened with **pride**, he was deposed from his royal throne and stripped of his glory.
- Dan. 11:12** When the army is carried off, the king of the South will be filled with **pride** and will slaughter many thousands, yet he will not remain triumphant.
- Hos. 13:6** When I fed them, they were satisfied;  
when they were satisfied, they became **proud**;  
then they forgot me.
- Am. 6:8** The Sovereign LORD has sworn by himself – the LORD God Almighty declares:  
“I abhor the **pride** of Jacob  
and detest his fortresses;  
I will deliver up the city  
and everything in it.”
- Am. 8:7** The LORD has sworn by the **Pride** of Jacob: “I will never forget anything they have done.
- Ob. 3** The **pride** of your heart has deceived you,  
you who live in the clefts of the rocks  
and make your home on the heights,  
you who say to yourself,  
‘Who can bring me down to the ground?’
- Mic. 2:3** Therefore, the LORD says:  
“I am planning disaster against this people,  
from which you cannot save yourselves.  
You will no longer walk **proudly**,  
for it will be a time of calamity.
- Zph. 2:10** This is what they will get in return for their **pride**,  
for insulting and mocking the people of the LORD Almighty.

- Zph. 3:11** On that day you will not be put to shame  
for all the wrongs you have done to me,  
because I will remove from this city  
those who rejoice in their **pride**.  
Never again will you be haughty  
on my holy hill.
- Zch. 9:6** Foreigners will occupy Ashdod,  
and I will cut off the **pride** of the Philistines.
- Zch. 10:3** “My anger burns against the shepherds,  
and I will punish the leaders;  
for the LORD Almighty will care  
for his flock, the house of Judah,  
and make them like a **proud** horse in battle.
- Zch. 10:11** They will pass through the sea of trouble;  
the surging sea will be subdued  
and all the depths of the Nile will dry up.  
Assyria’s **pride** will be brought down  
and Egypt’s scepter will pass away.
- Lk. 1:51** He has performed mighty deeds with his arm;  
he has scattered those who are **proud** in their inmost thoughts.
- Ro. 12:16** Live in harmony with one another. Do not be **proud**, but be willing to  
associate with people of low position. Do not be conceited.
- 1Co. 4:6** Now, brothers, I have applied these things to myself and Apollos for your  
benefit, so that you may learn from us the meaning of the saying, “Do not go  
beyond what is written.” Then you will not take **pride** in one man over against  
another.
- 1Co. 5:2** And you are **proud**! Shouldn’t you rather have been filled with grief and  
have put out of your fellowship the man who did this?
- 1Co. 13:4** Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not  
**proud**.
- 2Co. 5:12** We are not trying to commend ourselves to you again, but are giving you an  
opportunity to take **pride** in us, so that you can answer those who take **pride** in  
what is seen rather than in what is in the heart.
- 2Co. 7:4** I have great confidence in you; I take great **pride** in you. I am greatly  
encouraged; in all our troubles my joy knows no bounds.
- 2Co. 8:24** Therefore show these men the proof of your love and the reason for our  
**pride** in you, so that the churches can see it.
- Gal. 6:4** Each one should test his own actions. Then he can take **pride** in himself,  
without comparing himself to somebody else,



**2Tim. 3:2** People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, **proud**, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy,

**Jas. 1:9-10** The brother in humble circumstances ought to take **pride** in his high position. But the one who is rich should take **pride** in his low position, because he will pass away like a wild flower.

**Jas. 4:6** But he gives us more grace. That is why Scripture says:  
“God opposes the **proud**  
but gives grace to the humble.”

**1Pt. 5:5** Young men, in the same way be submissive to those who are older. All of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another, because,  
“God opposes the **proud**  
but gives grace to the humble.”

**Rev. 13:5** The beast was given a mouth to utter **proud** words and blasphemies and to exercise his authority for forty-two months.
